Language study fees, university fees, language examination fees are reimbursed on completion. Two TRDs are given to your school. Regional travel assistance is available.


The Ministry of Education funds TPDL to help schools make effective provision for the Learning Languages curriculum area.

Language study

Local classes or a customised distance programme will support you in your language study. Length of language study depends on your language proficiency. Sitting internationally recognised examinations eg, DELF, SD, ZD, DELE, HSK, JLPT is supported.

Pedagogy

A 15 point University of Auckland 300 level course "Teaching Languages in Schools" is delivered regionally in 8 days (four 2-day blocks). This course can be taken as a Certificate of Proficiency or credited to BEd(Tcha) upgrade, GradDipEd or GradDipTESSOL.

In-school support

Teachers are visited once a term for lesson observations and evidence-based learning conversations to ensure the professional learning and development has a positive impact on student learning.

Language group meetings

Four after-school language-specific meetings integrate language, theory and classroom practice components and offer practice for the international language examinations.
