Fäeag Rotuam | Rotuman Language



Fäeag Rotuam ta (The Rotuman Language) has five basic vowels:

A E I O U. These basic vowels have the same pronunciation as other Pacific Languages and Te Reo Māori. There are also five variations to these vowels: Ä Å Å Ö Ü. These are slightly different ways of pronouncing the vowels A, O and U.

The basic vowels can be short or long with the long vowel sound indicated by a macron above the vowel. Long vowel sounds are slightly dragged out.

A, E, I, O, U

It is important to show this distinction as it affects the meaning of words. For example:

Koko	Kōkō	
(mischievous / bad)	(thorny / prickly)	
Toto	Tōtō	
(blood)	(to speak / utter)	

These are pronounced as in English with a few differences: The G is pronounced as the **NG** sound in SI**NG**. The R is slightly rolled. The J is pronounced like **CH** in **CHURCH** and never as **J** in **JUDGE** or **JUG**. The [] glottal stop is the sound made in the middle of the phrase Oh-oh or Uh-oh.
